RESOLUTION NO. 4

- 1 WHEREAS, the Congress of Delegates is the policy making and legislative body of the
2 American College of Osteopathic Family Physicians (ACOFP), and

4 WHEREAS, the Congress is made up of dedicated members who give of their time, energy,
5 and knowledge to advance the profession and the mission and goals of the ACOFP, and

7 WHEREAS, the Congress meets annually in conjunction with the ACOFP Annual Convention, and

9 WHEREAS, the work of the Congress is accomplished by debating and acting upon resolutions
10 submitted to it from a variety of sources, and

12 WHEREAS, in recent years, there have been decreasing numbers of resolutions for the
13 Congress to consider, and

15 WHEREAS, this paucity of resolutions fails to advance the profession or the mission and goals
16 of the ACOFP, and

18 WHEREAS, the ACOFP Constitution and Bylaws, current ACOFP Policies, and the Rules of the
19 Congress are all silent on who may submit a resolution to the Congress; now,
20 therefore be it

22 RESOLVED, that a resolution may be submitted to the American College of Osteopathic
23 Family Physicians (ACOFP) Congress of Delegates by any ACOFP Active, Honorary,
24 Life, or Academic member whose applicable dues and assessments are paid in full, by
25 the ACOFP Board of Governors and standing committees, or by any ACOFP Affiliate
26 Society.
