RESOLUTION NO. 26

1	WHEREAS, health care discrepancies exist in the care of Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual,
2	Transgender, Questioning/Queer and Intersex (LGBTQI) patient populations; and
3	Transgender, Questioning, Queer and intersent (1921 Qr) parient populations, and
4	WHEREAS, patient reluctance to report sexual orientation and behavior can lead to failure
5	to screen, diagnose, or treat important medical problems, and
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7	WHEREAS, physicians' nonjudgmental recognition of the sexual orientation and behavior
8	enhances the ability to render optimal patient care in both health and illness; and
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10	WHEREAS, current educational guidelines inadequately train physicians to
11	comprehensively care for the LGBTQI patient; now, therefore be it
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13	RESOLVED, that the American College of Osteopathic Family Physicians (ACOFP)
14	encourages members of the American Association of Colleges of Osteopathic
15	Medicine (AACOM) and other educational groups to include and expand the Lesbiar
16	Gay, Bisexual, Transgender, Questioning/Queer and Intersex (LGBTQI) health issue
17	in the curriculum for medical education; and, be it further
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19	RESOLVED, that the ACOFP explore opportunities to collaborate with other organizations,
20	focusing on issues of mutual concern, in order to provide the most
21	comprehensive and up-to-date education and information to physicians to enable
22	the provision of high quality and culturally competent health care to LGBTQI
23	patients.
