SUBJECT: The Full, Complete, Unrestricted and Independent Practice of Medicine by **Nurse Practitioners** Texas Society of the American College of Osteopathic Family Physicians SUBMITTED BY: REFERRED TO: 2018 ACOFP Congress of Delegates **RESOLUTION NO. 18** WHEREAS, that the American College of Osteopathic Family Physicians (ACOFP) advocates for physician led healthcare teams based on their medical education and postgraduate training; and WHEREAS, ACOFP recognizes that physicians (MD/DO) are the only entity licensed by state medical boards to engage in the full, complete, unrestricted and independent practice of medicine; and WHEREAS, Nurse Practitioners are licensed by state nursing boards to practice nursing and are not regulated by state medical boards; and WHEREAS, Nurse Practitioners are not subject to the same regulations as physicians and physician assistants and are attempting to change their scope of practice from nursing to the full. complete, unrestricted and independent practice of medicine; and WHEREAS, regulation and licensing for all providers of the full, complete, unrestricted and independent practice of medicine should be under only one regulatory body to assure safe quality medical care for all; and WHEREAS, state boards of nursing were commissioned to regulate nursing practice and not the full. complete, unrestricted and independent practice of medicine; and WHEREAS, when nurse practitioners diagnose and treat an illness they are practicing medicine and not nursing and should be subject to the same rules and regulations as physicians and physician assistants; now, therefore be it RESOLVED, that the American College of Osteopathic Family Physicians (ACOFP) remain opposed to the full, complete, unrestricted and independent practice of medicine by nurse practitioners and the regulation of this practice by state boards of nursing, and be it further: RESOLVED, that the ACOFP will continue to work with state and national entities American Academy of Family Physicians (AAFP), American Osteopathic Association (AOA) and American Medical Association (AMA) to educate and inform State and Federal Legislators regarding the dangers in the unsupervised, full, complete, unrestricted, and independent
