RESOLUTION NO. 28

- 1 WHEREAS, the American College of Osteopathic Family Physicians (ACOFP) is an independent
2 organization and is incorporated in the State of Illinois; and

- 4 WHEREAS, the ACOFP Constitution & Bylaws belong to the ACOFP membership; and

- 6 WHEREAS, requiring membership in another organization in order to participate as a member or
7 officer in the ACOFP has no justification; now, therefore be it

- 9 RESOLVED, that the ACOFP Constitution, Article VI, Section 1. Qualifications, which states: “The
10 Governors shall be active or academic members in good standing of the College and must
11 be American Osteopathic Association (AOA) members” be amended by striking “and must
12 be members of the AOA.”
