RESOLUTION NO. 22

1	WHEREAS, opioid prescriptions are still a major health issue in America; and
2 3	WHEREAS, opioid overdosed deaths are estimated at 100 people per day in the United States per the Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) statistics; and
4 5	WHEREAS, governmental agencies are watching all concerned and especially physicians in greater numbers; and
6 7	WHEREAS, major United States government funding are allocated to the opioid crisis; and
8 9	WHEREAS, DEA and Department of Justice (DOJ) are employing joint forces focusing on opioid overuse; and
10 11 12	WHEREAS, documentation with correct diagnoses are required in all chart audits; and
12 13 14	WHEREAS, specific diagnoses are mandatory and required for opioid prescriptions; and
15 16	WHEREAS, all other medications must be used prior to opioid prescriptions; and
17 18	WHEREAS, education is the cornerstone of medical knowledge; now, therefore be it
19 20	RESOLVED, that the American College of Osteopathic Family Physicians (ACOFP) continue to offer pain management continuing medical education (CME).
