## **RESOLUTION NO. 11**

WHEREAS, Immunization Information Systems (IISs) serve a crucial role by consolidating patients'
 vaccination information into one place given the multitude of locations patients may receive
 vaccinations; and (1)

- WHEREAS, IISs may provide critical vaccination information to healthcare providers to determine
   which vaccinations are necessary, to patients for use in school enrollment and employment,
   and to public health agencies to develop programs to increase vaccination coverage and
   decrease vaccine-preventable diseases; and (1)
- 8 WHEREAS, public schools in all 50 states require K-12 students to show proof they are up to date on
   9 multiple vaccinations in order to attend (3); and
- WHEREAS, the lack of access to immunization records has resulted in an estimated 21% of children
   ages 19-35 months old to be immunized unnecessarily for at least 1 vaccine, with an associated
   annual cost of \$26.5 million (5) as well as confusion and frustration experienced by patients
   and families; and
- WHEREAS, there are currently 63 different state-, island-, and city-based IISs used in the United States,
   which each have varying levels of function and public accessibility (3) while operating
   independently in accordance with local and state policies (4); and
- WHEREAS, the establishment of a national immunization information system would achieve the CDC's
  "2018-2020 Immunization Information System (IIS) Strategic Plan," which sets an "IIS Vision"
  of creating "real-time, consolidated immunization data and services for all ages that are
  available anytime and anywhere for authorized clinical, administrative, and public health users
  and consumers"; now, therefore be it (7)
- RESOLVED, that the American College of Osteopathic Family Physicians (ACOFP) advocate to the
   Centers for Disease Control and Prevention to create a national immunization information
   system documenting each patients' immunization history that is, efficient, responsive, cross platform compatible, user-friendly, and freely accessible by healthcare providers.
