RESOLUTION NO. 16

1 2	WHEREAS, transgender is an umbrella term for a diverse group of people such as male-to-female (MTF) and female-to-male (FTM), genderqueer people, and others; and
3 4	WHEREAS, transgender identity or expression differs from societal expectations of how they should look, act, or identify based on the assigned sex at birth ¹ ; and
5 6	WHEREAS, transgender and other gender and sexual minority people are often the targets of discrimination and harassment that can lead to negative health outcomes ² ; and
7 8	WHEREAS, one in five transgender people postponed or did not try to get health care in the past year due to fear of discrimination ³ ; and
9 10	WHEREAS, fifty percent of transgender people reported having to teach their healthcare provider about transgender health issues ⁴ ; now, therefore be it
11 12 13	RESOLVED, that the American College of Osteopath Family Physicians (ACOFP) offer continuing medical education designated to address healthcare for transgender and gender diverse people in the eLearning Center that is accessible to all members and, be it further
14 15 16 17 18 19 20	RESOLVED, that the American College of Osteopathic Family Physicians (ACOFP) offer continuing medical education designated to address healthcare for transgender and gender diverse people that includes best clinical practices, terminology, demographics, health disparities including increased risk of HIV infection and lower likelihood of preventative cancer screenings in transgender men, affirmative healthcare, gender affirmation treatment, including hormonal and surgical care, and ways to create a more inclusive environment for all patients and, be it further
21 22 23	RESOLVED, that the American College of Osteopathic Family Physicians (ACOFP) provide continuing medical education in the eLearning Center for a minimum of three (3) years and, be it further
