RESOLUTION NO. 18

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WHEREAS, the term transgender describes a person whose gender identity differs from the sex they were assigned at birth¹; and

WHEREAS, the term cisgender describes a person whose gender identity corresponds with the sex they were assigned at birth 2 ; and

WHEREAS, the transgender patient population is 1.4 million adults and 150,000 youth ages 13-17 in the United States, with youth making up the largest percentage (10%) of transgender individuals³; and

WHEREAS, the adult transgender population is more likely to comprise of racial and ethnic minorities, including Black/African-American (0.8%), Latino/ Hispanic (0.8%), and other races or ethnicities (0.6%), compared to White adults $(0.5\%)^4$; and

WHEREAS, compared to the cisgender population, transgender patients are at higher risk for psychosocial and health disparities due to discrimination, homelessness, unemployment, and violence⁵; and

WHEREAS, many transgender patients lack access to physicians in their communities who are comfortable and competent in providing transition-related care⁶; and

WHEREAS, transgender patients often face concerns or negative experiences due to physician biases that deter them from seeking medical services^{4,7}; and

WHEREAS, medical school education on LGBTQ curriculum is limited, as only 30.3% of medical schools teach about the topic of gender transitioning, which translates into lack of physician comfort and willingness to care for transgender patients^{6,8}; now therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the American College of Osteopathic Family Physicians (ACOFP) will actively encourage use and support of inclusive language when referring to transgender and gender nonconforming persons; and, be it further

RESOLVED, that the ACOFP advocate for legislative efforts to support transgender healthcare access and quality; and, be it further

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RESOLVED, that the ACOFP agrees that physicians of the Osteopathic profession are uniquely qualified to serve transgender patients, through compassionate care of the mind, body, and spirit.; and, be it further

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RESOLVED, that the ACOFP Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion (DEI) Advisory Group consider CME regarding LGBTQ+, gender identity, and gender transitioning so that as family physicians we can increase our knowledge and understanding to better treat our patients.
