SUBJECT: Early Entry Initial Certification Exam for Family Medicine Residents SUBMITTED BY: **ACOFP Resident Council** 2022 American College of Osteopathic Family Physicians (ACOFP) REFERRED TO: Congress of Delegates **RESOLUTION NO. 20** WHEREAS, the American College of Osteopathic Family Physicians (ACOFP) represents osteopathic family physicians; and WHEREAS, the American Osteopathic Board of Family Physicians (AOBFP) offers board certifications in osteopathic family medicine; and WHEREAS, board certification is a common prerequisite for hospital staff privileges; and WHEREAS, the AOBFP offers a traditional certification pathway and the Early Entry Initial Certification (EEIC) pathway; and WHEREAS, the benefits of the EEIC are a shorter length (200 vs. 400 items), lower cost (\$400 vs. \$500), and earlier certification compared to the traditional certification; and WHEREAS, eligibility for the EEIC requires two osteopathic in-service exams necessitating at least two post-graduate years prior to eligibility; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, the American College of Osteopathic Family Physicians (ACOFP) advocate for all

19 family medicine programs to encourage their resident physicians that meet the specified

criteria to become certified via the Early Entry Initial Certification Exam (EEIC) pathway due

21 to the shorter length, lower cost, earlier certification, and representation of osteopathic family
