Navigating the Differences in Board Certification: What You Need to Know

The American Osteopathic Board of Family Physicians (AOBFP) and the American Board of Family Medicine (ABFM) have some similarities. They both fulfill all ACGME requirements and both pathways show statistically similar data outcomes. However, there are some key differences to be aware of, covered below:
