Patient Care

- **History and Physical Interviewing Skills**: Exam complete, thorough, reliable with ROS; adequate interviewing skills; history is accurate, thorough; systematic and efficient
- **Clinical Judgement**: Able to analyze & synthesize clinical data; good selection of tests/studies; differential diagnosis complete; consistently integrates data, including risks & benefits
- **Patient management skills**: Able to initiate proper therapy, modify when needed, and/or make critical decisions "under pressure"; patient care is in an orderly, patient centered and cost effective manner; incorporates principles of preventive medicine and health promotion; coordinates care for continuity panel
- **Procedural Skills**: Consistent performance; good regard to patient comfort and safety; adequate use of instruments; utilizes appropriate technique; obtains informed consent appropriately and explains indications/contraindications
- (Osteopathic)- Incorporates osteopathic principles when obtaining a history, performing a physical examination, interpreting diagnostic test results, synthesizing a differential diagnosis when devising a patient care plan for patients
- (Osteopathic)-Performs an accurate and complete osteopathic structured exam, diagnoses somatic dysfunction and performs treatment of somatic dysfunction in patient conditions

Medical Knowledge

- **Specialty medical knowledge**: No major gaps in basics; well-integrated knowledge of ambulatory Family Medicine; good understanding of essential information; understands complex pathophysiology
- Demonstrates knowledge of how to manage chronic diseases in the continuity clinic setting
- (Osteopathic)- Applies knowledge of appropriate OMT techniques to formulate a patientcentered care plan
- (**Osteopathic**)- Understands absolute and relative contraindications to OMT and engages in the utilization of OMT when appropriate; recognizes own limitations in OMT/OPP.

Practice-Based Learning and Improvement

- **Record Documentation of Patient Care and Procedures**: Utilizes technology to complete documentation with critical and accurate information; patient records are completed in timely manner; uses EMR appropriately
- **Self-Directed Learning**: Shows good evidence of reading; incorporates technology well; uses scientific literature to guide care; performs self-assessment and feedback
- Able to compare key patient outcomes in own patient panel and the clinic panel to external standards and identifies areas for improvement

- **Billing and Coding**: Complies with regulations and promotes compliance among peers; attends necessary meetings; provides cost conscious care; documentation contains detailed diagnosis and appropriate ROS

- (Osteopathic)- appropriately documents somatic dysfunction and codes OMT

Professionalism

- **Respect**: Compassionate and considerate; consistently respectful; understands and incorporates cultural and interpersonal factors in care
- **Professional Ethics**: Honest; punctual for duty and takes responsibility; completes tasks in a timely manner; incorporates basic principles of medical ethics; takes initiatives to address errors
- **Professional Appearance**: Conducts self in a respectful, professional, and ethical manner (dress, timeliness, attitude, etc.) with accountability for and insight into his or her own behaviors
- Wellness: Appropriately manages personal wellness, especially in situations that challenge personal, emotional, and mental health. Demonstrates awareness of the importance of maintenance of emotional, physical, and mental health and personal growth
- (<u>Osteopathic</u>)- Incorporates recognition of patient's mind, body, and spiritual characteristics into osteopathic patient care.
- (Osteopathic)- Recognizes patient's unique perception of touch and how this influences osteopathic care.

Interpersonal and Communication Skills

- **Case Presentations**: organized and complete; easy to understand; recognizes and communicates the most important information
- **Clinic Communications**: checks and responds daily to patient messages and results; communicates with staff and colleagues to coordinate care for continuity panel patients; responds quickly and effectively to patient needs for forms, prescription refills and other requests
- Effectiveness with Patients and Families: initiates contact with patients; demonstrates good listening skills with patients; incorporates emotional and personal needs into the treatment plan; patients express confidence Effectiveness with Faculty/Staff/Other Health Professionals- cooperates well, interacts amicably and/or works productively with others; respects role of all health care provides; a real team player; others express confidence
- **Clinic and Evidence Based Teaching Skills**: actively looks up information; incorporates principles of Evidence Based Medicine; teaches students and other learners without complaints;
