Osteopathic Conference Facilitator Guide

The following are recommendations for osteopathic faculty to facilitate the resident case study presentations at the xxxxx.

- 1. The Program Coordinator will identify 1-2 resident physicians to present in either the morning or afternoon case study session.
- 2. A faculty member will be identified as the facilitator for a particular case study session (morning or afternoon). The facilitator will contact the resident physicians to help them identify a case 4- 6 weeks before the conference.
- 3. The resident will submit their presentation to the identified faculty minimum of 3 weeks prior to the conference presentation date. The faculty will review the presentations and give the residents feedback, if needed.
- 4. The goal of the presentation should be to have a 5-10-minute case study presentation followed by 2 OMT techniques demonstration and practice. The total time for the presentation should be approximately 30 minutes.
- 5. On the day of the conference, the faculty will assist the residents in table training/reviewing the OMT procedures. Faculty will also help keep the presentation limited to the 30-minute time period, if needed.
- 6. Finally, the faculty will give some brief in-person feedback to the residents on the quality of the presentation on day of presentation. Then, within 2 weeks of the conference, faculty will complete written evaluation.
- 7. The goal of this role is multifold:
 - a. To improve networking between residents and faculty statewide
 - b. To produce high quality CME level osteopathic family medicine conferences
 - c. To provide a venue for faculty to partially fulfill the scholarly activity requirements of ACGME Osteopathic Recognition
