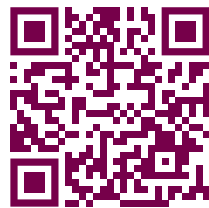

Choose the path that applies to you



Commercial Health Insurance

If you have **private or commercial health insurance**—including plans provided by your employer, plans you buy yourself, or those available under the Affordable Care Act—**this path applies to you.**



Government Health Insurance

There are a number of **government-funded healthcare programs**. Two of the most common are Medicare and Medicaid. **If you have either of these, this path applies to you.**

Request the ELIQUIS \$10 Co-pay Card*

- Eligible commercially insured patients may pay as little as \$10 per 30-day supply or \$10 for their first 90-day supply of ELIQUIS while enrolled in the program
- Patients may pay as little as \$30 for subsequent 90-day refills
 - Maximum annual benefit of \$2,000
 - Eligibility and terms and conditions apply*

Medicare & Medicare Part D

Medicare is federal health insurance for people 65 or older. While Medicare Part A and Part B provide coverage for hospital, inpatient, and outpatient care, Part D is the prescription drug coverage portion.

Medicaid

This program helps cover medical costs for some people with limited income and resources.

If you are on Medicaid, ELIQUIS costs, on average, \$3 per month, and 5 out of 10 patients pay \$0 per month.[†] To find out if you qualify for Medicaid, call **1-877-267-2323** or visit www.medicaid.gov.

Medicare Part D Overview

Medicare Prescription Payment Plan

- The Medicare Prescription Payment Plan gives you the option to spread your out-of-pocket (OOP) costs over the year

Contact your Medicare Part D insurance provider for more details about enrolling in the Medicare Prescription Payment Plan.

Maximum out-of-pocket

- The maximum OOP amount you pay for covered Medicare Part D drugs is \$2,100, including your deductible. Once this amount is reached, you'll pay \$0 for the rest of the year
- The Medicare Part D Coverage gap has been eliminated

Extra Help

- Extra Help (also known as the Medicare Low-Income Subsidy) is a form of financial assistance for some people with Medicare Part D drug coverage. To learn more and find out if you're eligible, call **1-800-772-1213** or visit ssa.gov/extrahelp

Deductible Phase

Medicare patients pay 100% of OOP Part D costs up to the deductible amount (Maximum: \$615)

Initial Coverage Phase

Medicare patients pay a portion of prescription drug costs through OOP co-pays or coinsurance—up to \$2,100 total (Amounts vary by plan)

Full Coverage Phase (No OOP costs)

Once the maximum OOP cost of \$2,100 has been reached, patients pay \$0 for Part D drugs for the remainder of the year



Follow a hypothetical Medicare Part D patient's cost journey

The following is for illustrative purposes only and uses an estimated average OOP cost of ELIQUIS based on the 2026 Medicare price of \$249 before any dispensing fees. The coinsurance amount is an average patients pay for branded drugs.

With Medicare Part D, patients pay, on average, just \$48 for ELIQUIS.”

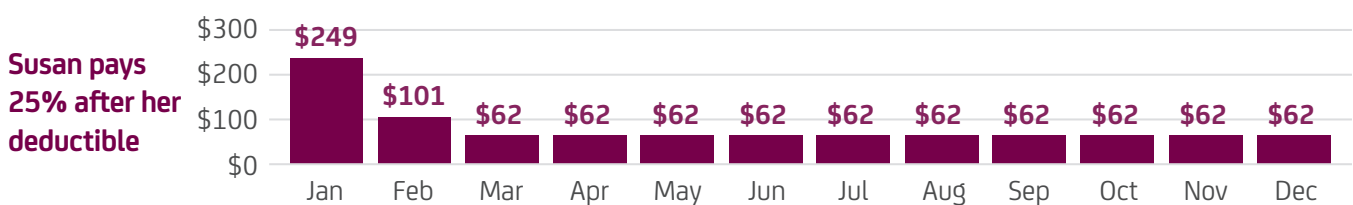
Actual OOP costs will depend on a patient's specific plan and number of medications.

Susan's journey over 1 year



Follow Susan's journey through the 3 phases of Medicare Part D to learn more (Not an actual patient)

Susan is a patient on Medicare who is taking **only ELIQUIS[†]** and not currently eligible for the Extra Help program. She has an insurance deductible of \$300 before she's responsible for 25% of her prescription drug coinsurance costs, up to the \$2,100 OOP maximum. **Susan will pay \$249** for ELIQUIS in January. In February, she will pay the rest of her deductible and her part of her insurance coverage. From March to December, **her cost for ELIQUIS will be approximately \$62.**



[†]Patients taking multiple medications will reach their deductible sooner than a patient taking only ELIQUIS.

Common Health Insurance and Prescription Coverage Terms



Private or commercial health insurance includes plans provided by your employer, plans you buy yourself, or those available under the Affordable Care Act.



Out-of-pocket costs are expenses that are not reimbursed by your insurance and are paid for on your own.



Public or government health insurance includes Medicare, Medicaid, and plans that cover military personnel and their families.



Deductible is the set amount you pay for prescriptions each year before your insurance plan starts to pay.



Medicare Part D is the prescription drug coverage portion of Medicare insurance.



Coinsurance is the percentage a patient may pay for their prescription drug costs after the deductible has been met.
